The Rotary Club of Auburn, Alabama, USA, extends its sincere congratulations on the celebration of the completion of Rotary International's second century of service.

During the first century, our club is most proud of the following service projects of our Rotary club and that of Rotary International:

1. We have initiated a project to deliver food to the needy people in our area, working in conjunction with the East Alabama Food Bank. Each year, we have committed to deliver over 7000 lbs of food on four separate occasions. We have also joined with other Rotary clubs to help fund a truck which carries the Rotary emblem; the truck contains a refrigerated section to allow fresh vegetables and dairy products to be delivered.
2. We have started the internationally celebrated Babies Love Books Centenary Project. Every baby born at the East Alabama Medical Center receives a package that includes "Goodnight Moon" to have read to them by their parents, as well as a Rotary package of information on the need to develop literary skills from an early age.
3. We have participated in several matching grant projects, including the building of a clean blood bank in India, a hydroponic food station in Thailand to help grow food quickly after the devastating Tsunami of 2005, a mobile TB clinic in South Africa, and computer equipment for children in Brazil.
